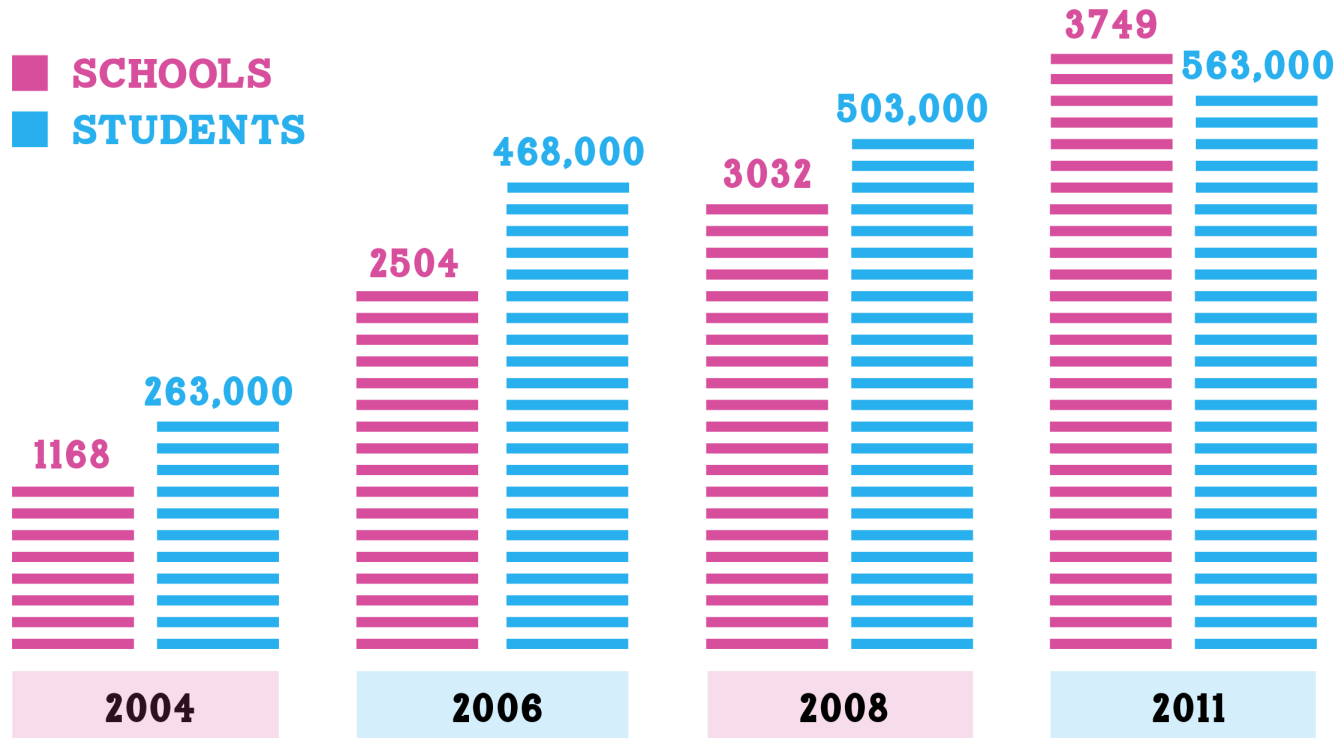

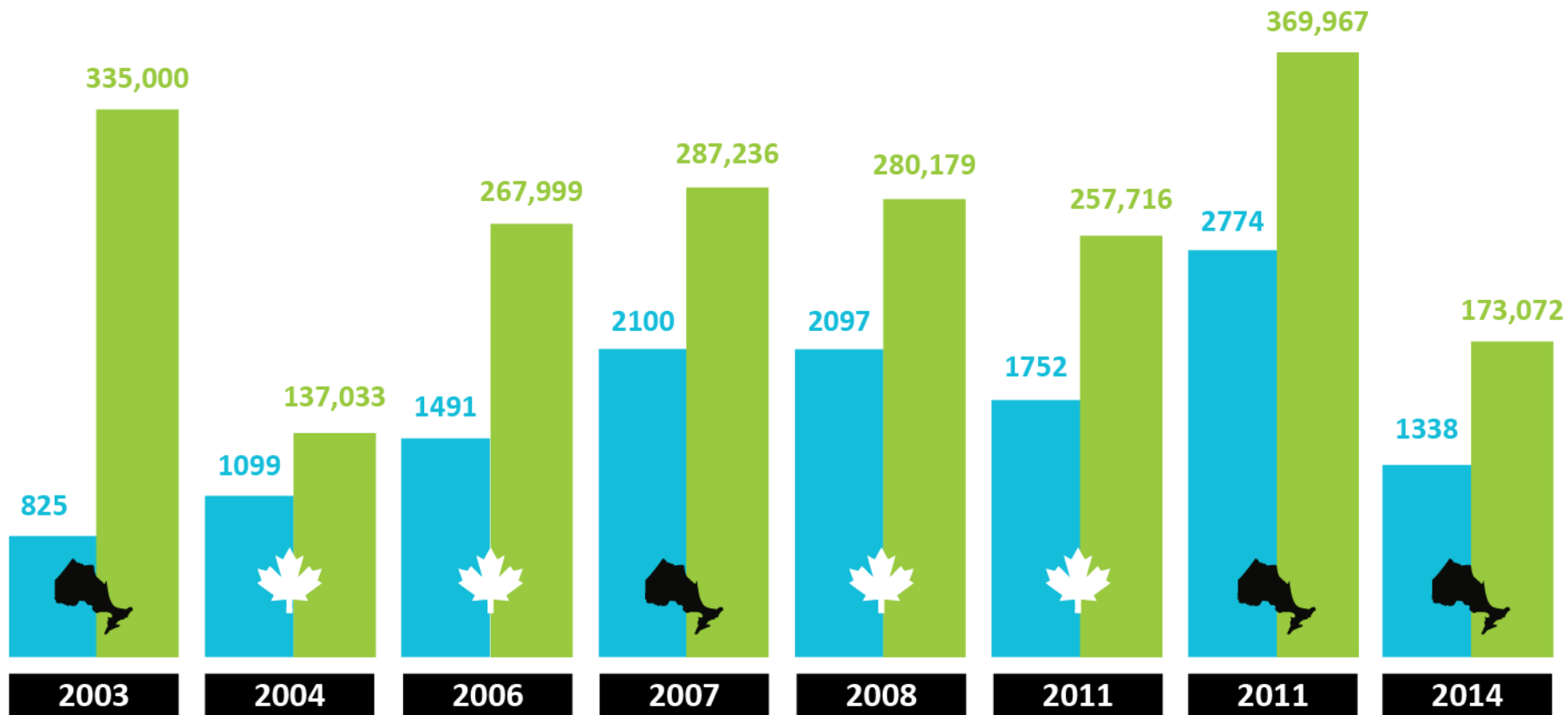

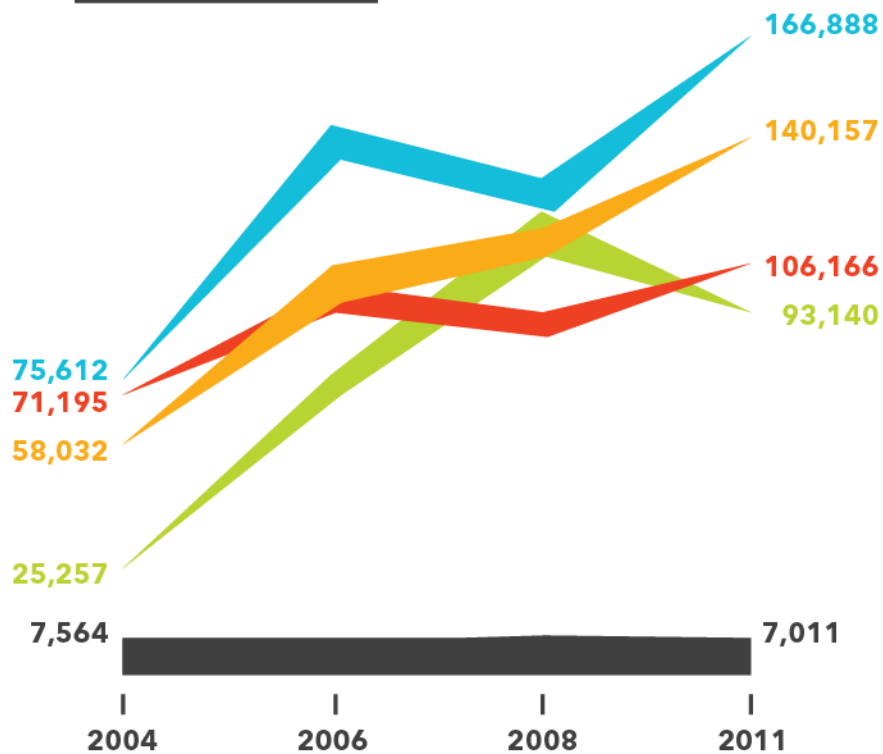
2014 ELECTION RESULTS

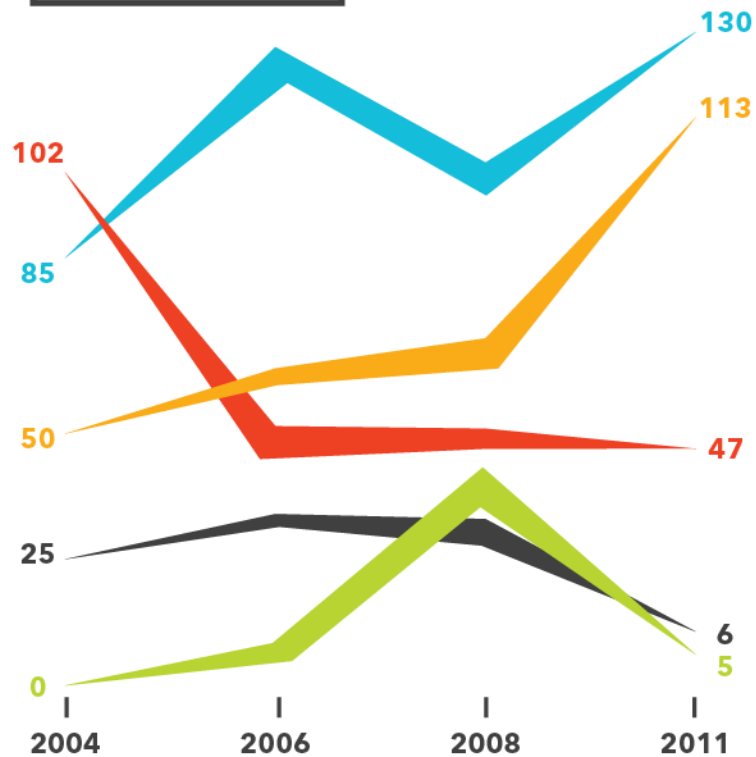
Votes Cast

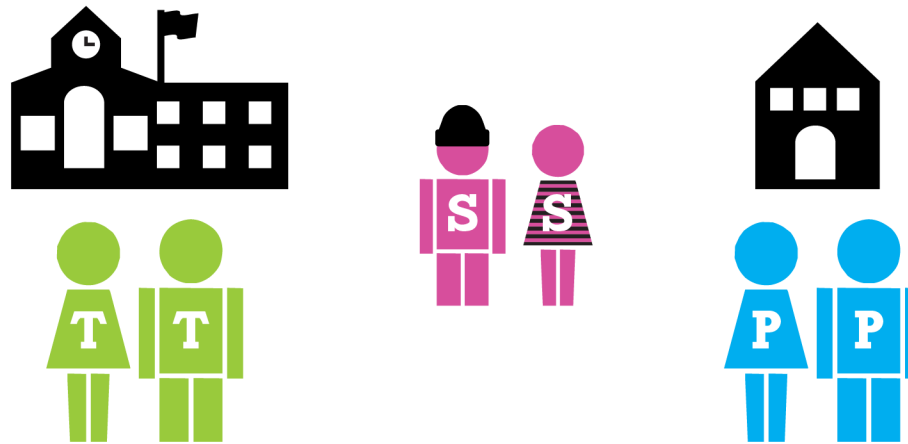

The evaluation analyzed the impact of the program on teachers, students and parents.



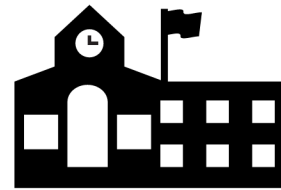
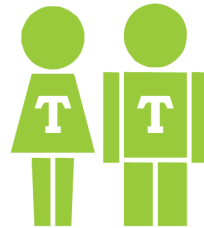

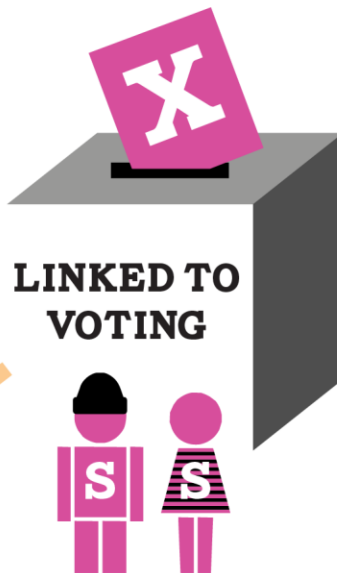

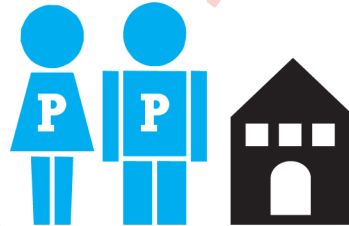

IMPACT ON PARENTS

65% felt that the experience increased their own interest

84% felt that it provided their family with more opportunities to learn about and discuss politics



61% felt that their child's participation in the program increased their own knowledge of politics and elections

20% of those who voted reported that their child's participation positively affected their decision to vote
